Central Powers Collapse:

1917:

- Czar Nicholas of Russia abdicates → provisional govt.
 - Bolsheviks overthrow govt. and sign a treaty with Germany ("peace and bread")
- USA declares war on Germany (angered by sinking of their neutral ships and passenger liners)

Germans could focus on Western Front →one last ditch effort to win the war

- Exhausted themselves and their supplies
- The "Hundred Days"

Armistice signed in a railway car in France

- fighting officially stops at 11am, Nov 11, 1918
- A CDN soldier was the last to die on the Western
 Front → by a sniper's bullet just before the armistice

 → Private George Price

Canada on the World Stage:

Allies met with Germany at <u>Paris Peace Conference</u> to discuss the terms of peace

- Based on Canada's military record during war, Borden fought for Canada's place at the table and got it!
- US President <u>Woodrow Wilson</u> proposed his <u>14 Points</u> (emphasized forgiveness)
 - but French and Belgium leaders wanted compensation for damages

Treaty of Versailles:

- 1. German "guilt clause"
- 2. German reparations = \$30 billion
- 3. Reduced German territory in Europe (Poland)
- 4. German army restricted to 100 000 (no U-boats)

* European economies in ruins \rightarrow Germany couldn't afford reparation payments. Also, they resented the guilt clause!

Borden fought to have Canada become a member of the **League of Nations**

- Established by Treaty of Versailles
- Based on "Collective Security" (members cooperating in suppressing aggression)
- Many concerns about the League

The League was more idealistic than practical

- Nations couldn't work together
- No military force of its own to restrict aggression
- USA didn't join the League (although it was Wilson's brainchild!)

Aftermath of the War:

Crops and transportation systems ruined in Europe

Spanish Flu epidemic (est. deaths = 22 million worldwide)

 Public places and schools closed for months to try and stop the spread
