End of the Medieval Ages

- so why did the Medieval Ages end?
 - lasted for nearly 1000 years (500ish 1500ish)
 - · affected society in every different way
- there are many possible reasons for its decline:
- a) People moved off farms to cities
 - o less people to grow food and work for lords
 - o now lower-classed people could be rich and successful
- b) The rise of governments
 - o control shifted from nobles to kings who sought to centralize power (keep it for themselves)
 - o these "kingdoms" were early forms of government that led to nation building
 - o after a period of time, countries like England had real parliaments which ran without kings
 - cancelled out the whole feudal system of rule
- c) New Technology
 - o with the introduction of longbows and gunpowder, knights were not as effective anymore
 - ♦ like the samurai in Japan, when guns start getting used, it helps to end the samurai's control
 - o now, people did not have to fear knights if they had a big enough gun...
- there are lots of possibilities, but the fall of Feudalism (all three things above) results in the end of the Medieval Ages
