The Renaissance - The Reformation

- in the Renaissance, everyday people began to read and write, and this was very powerful

 when dealing with the Church, now people could make up their own minds about faith

- o could see just how corrupt the church really was
- 'Reformation' refers to "Reforming the Church"
- people began to create their own Christian churches
 - · decided how and when and why they would worship
 - became known as "Protestants"
 - o b/c they were protesting the Church's rule
- Martin Luther was the first to openly challenge the church's authority
 - was a gifted student and model churchgoer
 - became a teacher of other monks but had trouble believing what he was told
 - came to the conclusion that the way to heaven was by faith alone
 - o none of this other corrupt stuff that the church was doing for a thousand years
 - he wrote a paper titled 'The 95 Theses'
 - o had 95 complaints that he had with the church
 - o nailed it to his church's door in Wittenberg
 - wasn't very popular at first, but was translated and published and sparked the Reformation!

- once people all over Europe began to read his writing, they also wanted change
- many different churches sprung up all over
 - ⇒Lutheran (Luther's church)
 - ⇒Anglican
 - ⇒Calvinist
 - ⇒Anabaptist
 - ⇒etc.
- the Catholic Church wasn't happy, but once the information was out, what could they do?
- tried a counter-reformation, but it wasn't successful
- created the **Inquisition** to torture Protestants into admitting witchcraft
 - o thousands died, but people didn't stop their beliefs
