## Water: World's #1 Resource

- estimated that 1.2 billion people don't have clean water
  - this will double by 2025
- water in the developing world is used for mainly for agriculture, not for people
  - many developing countries have a dry season, and this leads to massive shortages
- aid programs and water subsidies often go to the rich, not the poor who need it but can't afford it
- to make matters worse, it is estimated that 80% of diseases are caused by contaminated drinking water
  - cholera, leprosy, typhoid, etc.

## How Do We Help? - Solutions

most parts of the world do not help as much as they couldmore money is spent on weapons than on any sort of aid

programs:

- 1998, US spent \$780 billion on defense
- for \$6 billion, everyone could have a basic education
- for \$9 billion, everyone could have sanitized and safe water
- for \$12 billion, women could have safe reproductive health
- what do people truly care about?

## Canada's Role

- Canada is a forerunner for international aid
- we give millions every year to help others
  - about 30% of this aid is tied aid
    - o means that this money comes with conditions
    - we expect something in return (goods, services, resources, etc.)
- aid programs can come from Canada's CIDA (CDN International Development Agency)
  - iodine programs, saline programs, sexual health programs, etc.
- aid also comes from NGOs (Non-Gov't Organizations)
  - Red Cross, Rotary International, etc.
- how are things now?
- we dropped to an all-time 30 year low for donating and helping international aid over the last couple years
  - o less than 0.27% of our GDP
- Canada could help and really make a difference, but we don't do as much as we could
